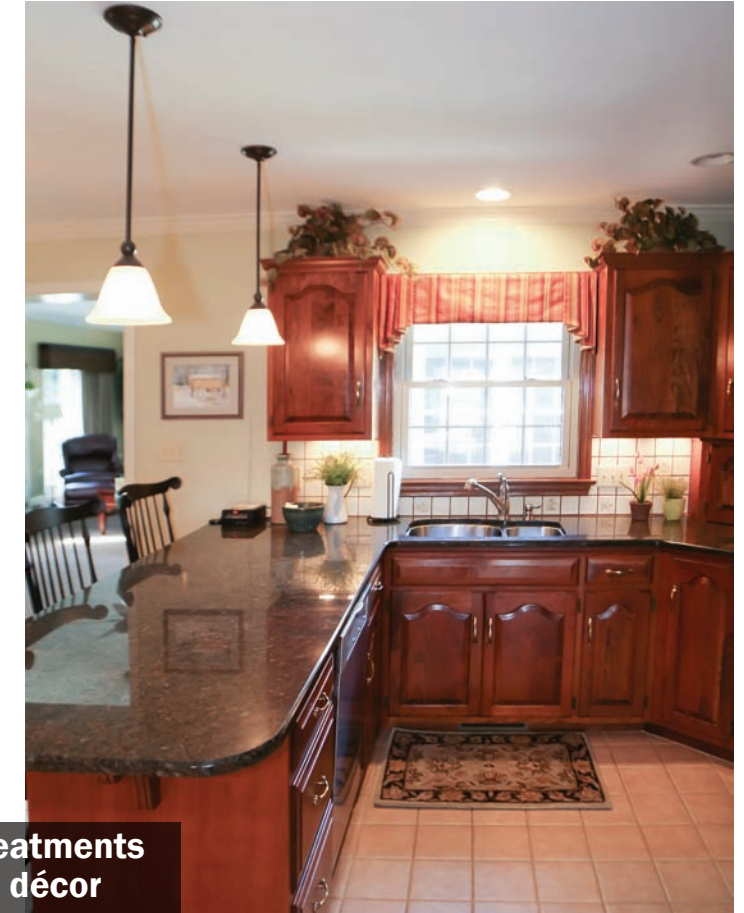

Typical of the homes built at the time, the original kitchen was small with very limited natural light. By removing the interior wall separating the kitchen from the seldom used living room, the homeowners were able to expand the kitchen and provide a well-lit dining and sitting area. In addition, the new open-floor plan provides much improved traffic flow as well as a more conducive space to entertain.



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For reference, while the wall housing the above pantry cabinetry was removed, the above door can be seen below (right side, just beyond the hutch/server). Those with a sharp eye will also notice that the above cabinetry was reused.
